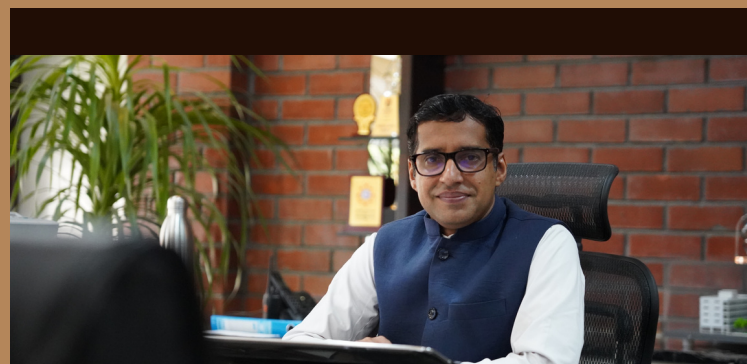
So join us as we take you on a journey through the pages of "Eloquence" to witness the creativity and passion that runs deep in our community.

## Interdepartmental Expert Talk

# Emerging Renewable Energy Technologies in Rural Development



The event was amazing and a testament to the hard work and dedication of Christ College Pune's Department of Management which hosted a guest lecture on "The City and its Water: How are Cities Managing Their Water and Water Waste" for students of SY BBA(CA), FY BBA, and FY BBA (IB). Mr.Bejoy, who works in Pune, was the session's resource person.

The speaker provided insights into the relationship between the environment and development during the session. He is known to have performed water resource management research, with a particular focus on Peri Urban Bangalore. The students were enlightened on the potential for wastewater recycling as the speaker discussed the methods and benefits of this approach. It was an informative and engaging talk that left the students with a better understanding of environmental sustainability and its practical applications.

The attention to detail and careful planning made this corporate talk a resounding success.

Mr. Sudarshan Sharad Nasery, Business Development/Sales and Marketing Manager of Thyssenkrupp Industries India, touched on the expectations which industries have for fresh graduates. Students learned about the skills they need to develop further, such as interpersonal skills, intellectual abilities, communication skills, in order to grow as individuals ready for the corporate life. The speaker also emphasized the importance of learning from our mistakes. The session was highly interactive, with students learning about the significance of bridge courses and the common mistakes and misconceptions graduates have during their early years.

The students were given a unique opportunity to gain insights into the inner workings of the organization, including the work culture and the various roles within it. They realized how the evolving business landscape has necessitated a significant shift in talent acquisition strategies. The session was highly informative and the students were left with a greater understanding of the current state of the industry and necessary skills required to succeed in it.



The "Best Investment Options in India " this event was hosted for SY BBA AND TY BBA students where Mrs. Suma Sunny, an independent writer, researcher, and financial journalist, served as the session's resource person. She is a regular contributor to leading Malayalam financial portals. The event took place on December 2 2022. She has over 20 years of experience as a stock trader and financial analyst.

During this session, she discussed the various factors to consider before investing in stocks, the various types of shares available based on market capitalization as well as the advantages and disadvantages of cryptocurrency. She elucidated why cryptocurrencies are illegal in India and other countries, the future of cryptocurrency and blockchain, as well as the various investment options available. The event raised awareness about cryptocurrency and the current investment options available to college students.



It allowed them to comprehend the various trading strategies and processes involved in investing via SIP as well as investigate the issues surrounding cryptocurrency ownership and crypto regulations in India. As a result, students learned the fundamentals of trading and profiting from stocks and shares. They can now decide whether dealing with cryptocurrency will be beneficial or if they'd rather pursue other investment options.



On October 17 2022, the Department of Management hosted a Guest Lecture for SYBBA, SYBBA [IB], and SY BBA [CA] students by Mr. Neeraj Thomas, the session's resource person, who provided students with valuable insights into CAT and other competitive exam preparations. Mr. Neeraj Thomas is an MBA, and competitive exam consultant from Educrack Pune with over 16 years of experience. He has significant expertise in the field of education and also advises students interested in pursuing higher education. This session addressed students' concerns about their career options after graduation. He also emphasised the significance of reflecting on our own understanding of who we are, our preferences, and which stream best suits our interests.

Sir then went on to explain the importance of pursuing an MBA and how this postgraduate degree aids and boosts our ability to achieve our desired management goals and how getting an MBA immediately after graduation is more important than working before receiving an MBA. This session was truly eye-opening for many students.



The session was an overwhelming success, with attendees gaining a wealth of knowledge and insights into their career options and professional development. The speaker provided valuable guidance and advice on how to navigate the ever-changing job market and achieve their respective career goals.



11th November 2022

The corporate talk was a tremendous success, with attendees leaving the room feeling inspired and motivated, the topic being "**Dimensions of Organizational Culture and its Impact on Change Management**" for SY BBA students on November 11th, 2022. Ms. Devika Date, Business Associate Director, Human Capital, PWC was the session's resource person.



During this session, the speaker discussed how organisational culture distinguishes one group of people from another. Students gained an understanding of organisational culture, which encompasses the values and practises that guide and inform team members' actions. The speaker also discussed the various types of organisational cultures that aid in assessing strategic changes for fostering an environment, conducive to the team's success.

Students need to be made aware of organizational culture in order to gain a better understanding of the organization's values and practices, and have a clear understanding of how a team thrives within a positive organizational culture. Comprehending the significance of organizational culture in change management, is also an important takeaway from this talk. Attendees were thoroughly impressed by the quality of the corporate talk which was informative, well-structured and engaging from start to finish. It was brilliantly organized and executed showcasing the expertise of the organizers skills and the speaker knowledge.

# Blood Donation Camp

The Department of Management and the NSS unit of Christ College Pune, in collaboration with Akhil Bhartiya Terapanth Yuvak Parishad, held a blood donation drive on the Christ College campus on September 17, 2022. Blood donation is beneficial to one's health. It lowers the chances of developing hemochromatosis. After donating blood, the body will replenish the blood loss, by promoting the formation of new blood cells. Christ College's blood donation camp, in collaboration with NSS, successfully collected 106 units of blood.

The camp began at 10 a.m. with a brief inaugural ceremony addressed by Principal Father Arun Antony to the team of 8 medical staff members, including three doctors and two assistants, as well as three helpers from the community with Pimpri Yashwantrao Chavan Memorial Hospital. The NSS team of ten members were also pre-programmed to assist with the drive. The doctors first clarified the students' doubts before providing health education on the facts and myths of blood donation. The NSS also provided refreshments to all students who volunteered to donate blood. Blood donors were given a certificate following their donation.



This drive created a sense of awareness within the students that "the blood you donate gives someone another chance of life".

- Understanding the community in which NSS volunteers work and understanding oneself in relation to one's community.
- To assist people who require blood during serious accidents or who are suffering from certain diseases.
- Many students were able to understand the significance of blood donation and dispel myths about it.
- Students were able to comprehend the situations in which people require blood transfusions and how such activities benefit those in need.

The students were able to connect with the community and learn about its needs.

# Cyber Security Awareness Programs

Cybersecurity Awareness Month is observed each October by both experts and amateurs in the field. 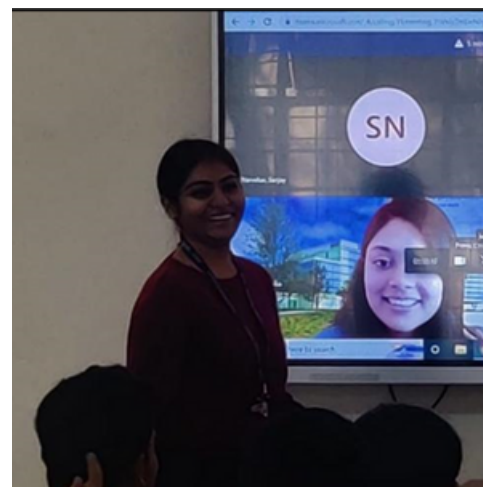


# PLACEMENT DRIVE
